#### **MANDATE**

Israel Deposit Law on Beverage Containers

Enacted: 1999 Implemented: 2001

Last Updated: 2010 - The new law set a collection target of 77% for deposit

containers, and prohibits manufacturers from applying for

exemption from meeting the targets.

Authority: Ministry of Environment

Target: 77% collection

## **PROGRAM SCOPE**

Material: Containers over 100ml and under 1.5l: PET, aluminum, metal, glass

Beverage type: All beverages

Excluded: Dairy products

#### **DEPOSITS AND FEES**

Deposit: Initiated by Producer/Distributor/Importer)

Deposit value: 0.3 ILS (€0.07, USD\$0.08)

Unredeemed deposits: ELA Recycling Corporation


Handling Fee: 0.07 ILS (to retail only)

#### SYSTEM OPERATOR

Clearing System: Centralized

System Operator & Administrator: ELA Recycling Corporation

ELA Recycling Corporation is a private non-profit organization owned by Israel's beverage manufacturers. Its goal is to promote, coordinate and fund selective collection, sorting and recycling of bottles and beverage containers as per law in Israel.







# **REDEMPTION SYSTEM**

Return to Retail/Municipal

Recycling Stations: Supermarkets and shops are obligated to take back up to 50

containers per person, per day.
